

Geese Fabric


8 rectangles - 6-1/2 x 3-1/2 inches

<u>Background Fabric</u> 16 squares cut at 3-1/2 inches


1. On each background square, draw one diagonal line from corner to corner. Lay a marked square on top of one goose fabric rectangle, right sides together, matching corners.



2. Sew on the drawn line. Trim off excess fabric 1/4 inch from seam. Press seam toward background.




3. Place second background square on goose rectangle on the opposite side. Note the angle of the drawn line - it is opposite from the first square. Sew on the diagonal line..



Trim and press the seam toward the background. Repeat this process until you have 8 geese units measuring $6-1/2 \times 3-1/2$ inches




4. Sew geese units into sets of two. Referring to the diagram on the back.



Goose Puzzle

 ${\bf 5}$. Sew all four sets together in a spinning pattern. Note pressing instructions for seams on diagram.



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
