

Geese in the Air

Finished 12 inches.

Background fabric

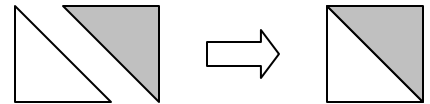
- cut 12 squares at 2-7/8". Cut each square on the diagonal once to make 24 triangles.

Goose Fabric

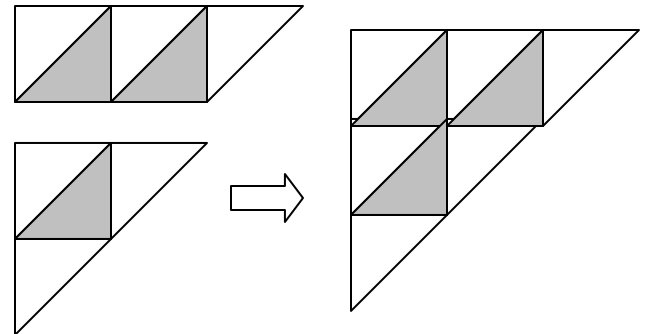
- cut 2 squares 2-7/8" from each of four colors. Cut each square on the diagonal once to make 12 triangles. You will have an extra triangle from each color left over. *Note: If using one color for all for Birds in the Air segments, cut 6 squares 2-7/8". Cut each square on the diagonal once to make 12 triangles.*

- cut 1 square 6-7/8" from each color. Cut on the diagonal one time to make 2 triangles. You will only need one triangle for each 6" segment of this block. *Note: if you are using one color for all four segments, cut two squares 6-7/8 inches. Cut once on the diagonal.*

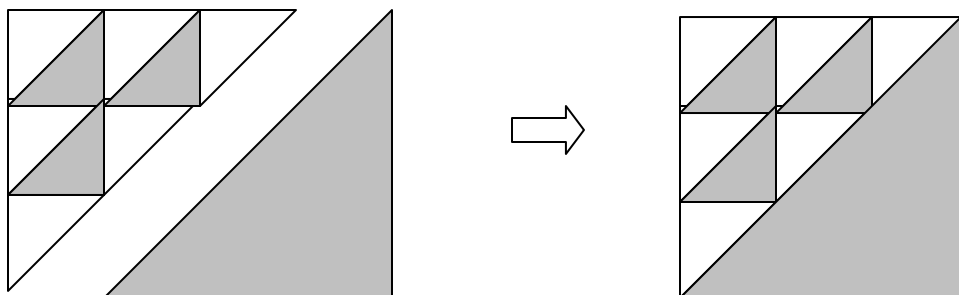
1. Sew a background triangle to each of the smaller print triangles to form 1/2 square triangles. Press to the darker fabric. Each square should measure 2-1/2".



2. Sew the matching 1/2 square triangles together with remaining background triangles as illustrated. For ease of construction, press top row seams the opposite direction from the second row. Be very careful of BIAS!



3. Sew matching larger goose triangle onto the pieced triangle. Again, be careful of BIAS! Each block should measure 6-1/2 inches. Press seams to larger triangle. Trim if needed.



4. Sew 4 segments together, matching seams. Remember to have all geese flying in the same direction. Press seams open,
