

Cutting: Geese on the diagonal are paper-pieced

- Geese fabric: 4 squares at $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut twice on the diagonal
- Background: 16 squares at 2-3/4", cut once on the diagonal
- Corner triangles: 2 squares at $3-1 / 4$, cut once on the diagonal
- Side Triangles: 1 square at $9-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut into quarters by cutting twice on the diagonal
- Center square: 1 square at $3-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$

1. Paper-pieced pattern-Starting with the corner points (cut from the $3-1 / 4$ inch squares), construct the flying geese strips. Refer to paperpiecing instructions on pages 2 and 3. Make four sets of geese. The FINISHED (not including seam allowances) measurement of this paper-pieced segment is notated on the master pattern. Make sure your piece is the same size!
2. Using two of the flying geese units, sew a side triangle to both sides. Be careful of BIAS edges! Press to the triangles.

3. Sew the remaining two geese units to opposite ends of the center square to make one long strip. Press to the center square.

4. Sew the larger triangles to each side of the long strip of geese. Press the direction the fabric wants to $g o$.
Block should measure
12-1/2" unfinished. See diagram
