

How Many Ways can a Goose Fly?

80" x 80"

Each and every block has something to do with a goose. Whether its the goose in your pond or the goose tracks on your quilt, learn the many ways to construct Flying Geese blocks.

You will need:

- Sewing machine and basic sewing supplies (pins, scissors, thread...)
- 1/4 inch presser foot
- Rotary cutting supplies - 24" ruler, a 10" or 12" square ruler

When the pattern refers to "geese" fabric, use any of your fabrics except background.

| <i>Fabric requirements</i> | |
| Background | 3 yards |
| Focus Fabric: for borders, binding <i>AND</i> some of the piecing | 3-1/4 yards |
| Coordinating fabrics: At least 5 different pieces | 1 yard cuts |

*Set aside 2-1/4 yards of focus fabric for your border and binding before you cut it up for blocks.
